TUITION FEES

OVERVIEW

- The maximum fee which publicly-funded UK Higher Education Providers can charge is currently **£9,000** (Wales) and up to **£9,250** (elsewhere in the UK)
- These levels are the same as for the 2017/18 academic year
- Tuition fee charges are to be decided by individual universities and colleges including if they charge different amounts for different courses.
- Students at private universities or colleges in the UK offering specifically designated courses are currently able to borrow up to **£6,165** towards tuition costs (students have to self-fund any additional fee charged).

TUITION FEES

TUITION FEE SUPPORT

- **A new system of tuition fee support is being introduced for 2018/19.**
- Tuition Fee Grants are still available for continuing students, but not new students.
- For full-time students starting a course in 2018/19, a non means-tested **Tuition Fee Loan** will be available to cover the full cost of tuition fees.
- Students can take out less than the maximum Tuition Fee Loan if they wish, and self-fund the remaining amount.
- For the 2018/19 academic year, students at private universities or colleges can borrow up to £6,165 towards tuition, but only if the course has been approved for funding by the Welsh Government (students self-fund any additional fee charged).

TUITION FEES

TUITION FEE SUPPORT: PAYMENT & REPAYMENT

- If a student takes out a Tuition Fee Loan, fees are paid to universities and colleges in instalments once the student has registered on their course.
- Instalments are as follows: 25% term 1, 25% term 2, 50% term 3
- Tuition Fee Loans are repayable, but only from the April after students leave university or college and only if their gross income is above the repayment threshold (currently £21,000 – due to change to £25,000 from April 2018)

SUPPORT FOR LIVING COSTS

CHANGES FOLLOWING DIAMOND REVIEW

- **A new system of living cost support is being introduced for 2018/19**
- All eligible students will receive the **same amount of money** to help towards living costs while studying.
- This will be the equivalent to the **National Living Wage**.
- Two types of support are available – Maintenance Loan and Welsh Government Learning Grant.
- The amount of loan available depends on where the student lives and studies.
- Support for living costs is paid directly into the student's bank account each term.

MAINTENANCE SUPPORT

WELSH GOVERNMENT LEARNING GRANT

- A minimum grant of £1,000 for all eligible students.
- Any additional grant will be based on the student's household income.
- Students from households with an income of up to £18,370 will be entitled to the maximum of £8,100*.
- Students from households with an income of up to £59,200 will be entitled to a partial grant.

*Based on them living away from home outside of London.

PART-TIME COURSES 2018/19

TUITION FEE LOAN AMOUNTS

Fee loan (or the fees charged by the college, whichever is lower):

- Maximum loan for Welsh students in Welsh HEPs - £2,625
- Maximum loan for Welsh students at Open University - £2,625
- Maximum loan for Welsh students in Other UK HEPs - £6,935
(£4,625 for designated courses at privately funded Other UK HEPs)
- Maximum loan for EU students in Welsh HEPs - £2,625

PART-TIME COURSES 2018/19

SUPPORT FOR LIVING COSTS: CHANGES FOLLOWING DIAMOND REVIEW

- Eligible part-time students starting courses on or after 1 September 2018 can apply for:
 - a Welsh Government Learning Grant (WGLG)
 - a Maintenance Loan
- All eligible part-time students are entitled to a non-means-tested minimum level of WGLG, determined by the intensity of study.
- This level is based on the £1,000 minimum available to full-time students.
- So a part-time student studying at 50 per cent of full-time hours would receive a minimum grant of £500.

PART-TIME COURSES 2018/19

SUPPORT FOR LIVING COSTS: CHANGES FOLLOWING DIAMOND REVIEW

- The level of grants and loans are dependent on the number of hours of study (i.e. the intensity of study) and household income.
- Support for part-time students is based on a full-time equivalent amount of £6,650, pro-rated by intensity of study.
- For part-time courses, the maximum hours of study cannot be more than 75% of those of a full-time equivalent course (i.e. 75% intensity).
- Therefore, the maximum amount of loan and grant combined available to part-time students is 75% of £6,650, which is **£4,987.50**.

NHS COURSES

STUDENTS TAKING NHS COURSES IN WALES

The Welsh government has confirmed that for those individuals who elect to study an eligible health related programme in Wales from September 2017 onwards the current NHS Bursary will be available

- This will apply to **all** students (Wales and rUK domiciled)
- Based upon individuals committing in advance to take up the opportunity to work in Wales post qualification for a period of two years
- Otherwise, Welsh domiciled students will have access to the standard student support package available from Student Finance Wales
- Standard UG package of support also available from SFE/SFNI/SAAS for rUK students studying healthcare courses in Wales

NHS COURSES

STUDENTS TAKING NHS COURSES IN WALES

Eligible courses

Students must be accepted for an NHS-funded place on a full or part-time course which leads to professional registration as a:

- doctor or dentist (they will be eligible for an NHS bursary after the fourth year of their course)
- chiropodist (including podiatrist), dietitian, occupational therapist, physiotherapist, radiographer, healthcare scientist, paramedic, speech and language therapist
- dental hygienist or dental therapist
- nurse or midwife

NHS COURSES

STUDENTS TAKING NHS COURSES IN WALES

NHS Wales support

Students on eligible courses may be able to get a non-repayable fixed grant of £1,000 per year, and a bursary from NHS Wales. A bursary is a yearly payment to help with living costs. It's paid each month and doesn't have to be paid back.

- Eligible students will also have no tuition fees to pay.
- Full-time students on NHS degrees can also (subject to eligibility) apply for
 - additional support if they have a disability, health condition, or caring responsibilities
 - help with the costs of going on placements

SFW support

Full-time NHS students can also apply to Student Finance Wales for a reduced rate Maintenance Loan which is not dependent on income.

NHS COURSES

STUDENTS TAKING NHS COURSES IN WALES

The following process is in place for Welsh students taking healthcare courses in Wales who choose **not** to take up bursary funding and instead apply for the standard package of support from Student Finance Wales

(i.e. those students who don't wish to commit in advance to take up the opportunity to work in Wales post qualification for a period of two years).

- NHS Wales will provide a **registration number** that should be used when applying, to confirm to Student Finance Wales that the student is not bursary funded.
- Students send their registration number to the mailbox **bursary_opt_out@slc.co.uk**

NHS COURSES

FUNDING FOR WELSH STUDENTS TAKING NHS COURSES IN ENGLAND

From 2017/18 no NHS Bursary is available to new students in England (with the exception of the fifth year onwards of Medicine/Dentistry courses).

Eligible students ordinarily resident in Wales but pursuing these courses in England can instead apply for the standard student finance package from SFW.

- In previous years, they would have applied to the NHS BSA in England and Student Finance England for their support.

Welsh domiciled students will also be able to apply for the **Learning Support Fund (LSF)*** from the NHS BSA in England which is available to students starting eligible courses from 2017/18 onwards, providing help with expenses incurred when going on placement.



*LSF has three elements: Travel & Dual Accommodation Expenses, Child Dependants' Allowance and Exceptional Support Fund.

STUDENT LOAN REPAYMENT

OVERVIEW

- Students won't make repayments until their future income is over **£21,000** a year gross, i.e. **£404** a week or **£1750** a month (before tax)
- The Welsh government will bring forward regulations to increase this threshold to **£25,000**, i.e. **£480** a week or **£2083** a month (before tax), from **6th April 2018**
- **Full-time students** begin to repay in the April after finishing their course.
- **Part-time students** can begin to repay in the April **four years** after they have started their course. (If their income is over the income threshold)
- Repayments will be 9% of income over the income threshold and will be deducted automatically from pay through the HMRC tax system for most students.
- If income falls below the income threshold, repayments will stop.




Any outstanding loan balance will be cancelled 30 years after entering repayment.

STUDENT LOAN REPAYMENT

UNDERSTANDING THE RATES

The interest rate is updated once a year using the RPI figure from March which is carried forward and applied in September:

STUDENT LOAN REPAYMENT

PARTIAL CANCELLATION OF LOANS

- Eligibility will be automatic once the student starts repaying their student loan, either voluntarily or when they are required to do so.
- Partial cancellation of up to **£1,500**.
- If they have a Maintenance Loan of £300 and the amount of their first repayment is £10, they will receive a partial cancellation of £290.
- If they have a Maintenance Loan of £3,000 and the amount of their first repayment is £50, they will receive a partial cancellation of £1,500.

APPLICATION INFORMATION

KEY MESSAGES

- Apply online at **www.studentfinancewales.co.uk** as soon as possible once the application opens to make sure student finance is in place for the start of their course.
- Register on UCAS and we can let students know when it's time to apply.
- They do not need a confirmed place at university or college to apply.
- Make a note of their account log-in details and keep them safe.
- Agree to share information from their application, this helps apply for many bursaries and some scholarships.
- Students will be assessed for non means-tested support if there are any delays in receiving household income information.

APPLICATION INFORMATION

COMPLETING AN APPLICATION – KEY MESSAGES FOR STUDENTS

Before starting an application, students should have the following to hand:

- passport – so SFW can check identity using valid UK passport details
- university and course details
- bank account details and National Insurance number
- parents' or partner's email address

Once they've submitted their online application:

- print, sign and send SFW their online declaration form
- send any evidence they've been asked for

APPLICATION INFORMATION

COMPLETING AN APPLICATION – KEY MESSAGES FOR STUDENTS

If parents or other sponsors will be supporting a student's application, they will need their own account on studentfinancewales.co.uk to provide information including:

- National Insurance number(s)
- Household income information
- Details of other child dependants

If sponsors can't submit income details online, they can complete a paper form.


